






Snake Removal

ROADWORKS UPDATE



Doodlakine South Road 12.54 – 18.47

Council has completed works on the Doodlakine South Road with the road being sealed in February 2023. In addition to the sealing Council asphalted critical intersections to ensure the longevity of the road pavement.

Goldfields Road (3.37 – 4.87 SLK) – This section is immediately off Great Eastern High heading East for 1.5km.

Council has completed the pavement works associated with this job however hasn't been able to program the wet-mixing or sealing due to Councils clearing permit delays. The permit is still being finalised after two years of work.

Hammond Street (Between Scott & Restdown St)

The works on Hammond Street to rectify the gravel section have been held over due to budget constraints and will be completed in the 2023/2024 budget program.

Deep Well Road

Council is currently programming works to rectify a culvert failure on this road from the rains in August 2022.

SHIRE OF KELLERBERRIN 2023/2024 ROAD PROGRAM

Council's Roadworks Advisory Committee meeting (21st March 2023) discussed the proposed 2023/2024 road program as per the following;

COMMODITY ROUTE FUNDING

Goldfields Road – 4.87 SLK - 5.77 SLK -

This work is a continuation from works commenced in the 2022/23 financial year where Council will reconstruct the 900m section of road, wet-mix and seal. The works will also include the construction of a concrete floodway with rock lined batters within the 900m section.

REGIONAL ROAD GROUP FUNDING

Doodlakine South Road – 5.97 SLK to 7.5 SLK

These works will reconstruct this section, widen to a carriageway of 11m and seal of 8m as per recent works conducted in the 2022/2023 financial year.

In addition to these works it is proposed to commence the clearing permit for works to be completed from 9.70 – 12.45 SLK.

Council will be also conducting a reseal of sections on the Doodlakine South Road as per the following SLK sections;

- 0.86 – 1.45
- 2.80 – 5.17
- 5.49 – 5.95

Kellerberrin-Yelbini Road – Clearing Permit Application

Council is preparing for works on the Kellerberrin-Yelbini Road. To ensure we can construct the road in a manner that will be fit for purpose Council requires a clearing permit to widen the carriageway. Council is fully aware of the timeline delays for clearing permits so to commence the process now allows Council the opportunity for affective planning.

ROADS TO RECOVERY

It is proposed to utilise this funding for the following projects depending of costings;

1. Sewell Street upgrades (Great Eastern Highway to Hammond Street)
2. Connelly Street – Moore Street to Hinckley Street
3. Hammond Street – Scott St to Restdown St rectification works.

On costings of the above Town Streets Council’s Roadworks Committee will provide a recommendation to Council on the finalised Capital Road Program.

It is interactive and fun!


A reimagined fairy tale, based on the book by the same name, with messages of kindness, by A.J. Bailey.


ANZAC Day

KELLERBERRIN MEMORIAL SWIMMING POOL REDEVELOPMENT

WOW, how much difference a month makes!!!

The Pool (being a little bias) is looking absolutely amazing.

The Pool construction itself being the body of the pool and surrounds is 98% complete with all the following being completed since the last report;

- Installation and Commissioning of Lighting Towers
- Concrete Concourse construction and sealing
- Pump and Plant room commissioned
- Fencing completed
- Landscaping including reticulation completed
- Shade Structures completed.

Council has also placed the order for additional seating for the BBQ areas and the BBQ's have arrived ready for construction.

The contractor is currently conducting tile inspections to ensure the tiling is adequate for the introduction of water and the Shade Sails will be installed prior to Easter.

Council in the background has also been working on the approval process through the Department of Health to ensure the facility receives official sign off for operations.

The Car park design is nearing completion, and the draft has been issued to contractors for a cost estimate to enable Council to allocate funding accordingly.

Council is very happy with how the construction has progressed however, we fully understand that with a dual-purpose facility there is some compromises but on the whole it will be one of the best facilities going around.


