## RECENT COUNCIL MEETING OUTCOMES

### July 2023 Council Meeting Outcomes

Council held its July Ordinary Council Meeting on Tuesday, 20th July 2023. Some of Council decisions included:

- Council endorsed the findings and management comments of the Interim Audit Report as presented by staff.
- Council adopted the 2023/2024 Budget.

### August 2023 Council Meeting Outcomes

Council held its August Ordinary Council Meeting on Tuesday, 15th August 2023. Some of Council decisions included:

- Council moved to send a request to the Minister for Lands under section 58(1) of the Land Administration Act 1997 for a permanent closure of Mather Road from 3.70 kms to 5.27 kms (CBH portion).
- Council establishing a Kellerberin Medical Reserve Account to be used to fund the provision of Medical Centre Facilities.

### September 2023 Council Meeting Outcomes

Council held its September Ordinary Council Meeting on Tuesday, 26th September 2023. Some of Council decisions included:

- Council adopted the Long-Term Financial Plan 2023/2024 – 2037/2038
- Council adopted to offer the community cropping to the Sport and Recreation Committee, though should the committee decline the offer Council is to advertise the community cropping program.

The Returning Officer received five (5) nominations for the five (5) vacancies therefore, nominees were declared elected unopposed by the Returning Officer.

The determination of terms for Councillors was decided by a ballot draw, in accordance with the *(Local Government Act 1995)* and the *(Local Government (Elections) Regulations 1997)*.



## ROADWORKS UPDATE

### Shire of Kellerberrin 2023/2024 Road Program

Council has commenced works on its 2023/2024 Road Program with the following:

#### Doodlakine South Road–5.97 SLK to 7.90SLK(Full Reconstruction)

Council has commenced works on this section of road with verge clearing being completed. Gravel carting has commenced which is expected to take two (2) to three (3) weeks to complete. Once the gravel overlay is complete Council will wet-mix the road and seal with two coat bitumen seal.

#### Doodlakine South Road–Reseal of the following sections; - 0.86–1.45, 2.80–5.17, - 5.49–5.95

Council has booked the sealing contractors to complete the resealing of sections on Doodlakine South Road commencing Monday 13th November 2023 with the works expected to take two (2) days to complete.

#### Doodlakine South Road–Clearing Permit Application for 9.70–12.45 SLK.

Councils consulting Natural Resource Management Officer is currently working through the application process with mapping and data collection for the permit application.

#### Kellerberrin Yelbini Road–Clearing Permit Application

Councils consulting Natural Resource Management Officer is currently working through the application process with mapping and data collection for the permit application.

#### Goldfields Road–3.37 SLK-4.87 SLK (Highway heading east 1.5 kms)(Carryover funding from 2022/2023)

Council has booked the wet-mixing contractor to commence works on Monday 30th October 2023 to enable Councils staff to complete final trim grading and rolling of the road to have the sealing commence 15th November 2023 on completion of Doodlakine South Road Re-seals.

## ROADWORKS UPDATE CONTINUED

### Goldfields Road–4.87–5.77 SLK

Council has completed preliminary works on this section of road with the following works being completed;

- Verge Clearing
- Culvert Replacement
- Gravel overlay

In conjunction with the first section of Goldfields Road the wet-mixing and sealing will be conducted in the one job as per timelines for Goldfields Road 3.37 - 4.87 SLK.

### Town Streets

Council is currently working with its consulting Engineer to complete the design drawings for the following works;

- Sewell Street–Highway to back lane
- Connelly Street–Reconstruct between Hinckley and Moore Street
- Reconstruct Hammond Street from Scott Street to Restdown St intersection renewal.

Works for the above jobs include new road surface, kerbing and footpath construction.

The above works are proposed to be conducted between November 2023 and February 2024. The affected homeowners that reside on these particular town streets will be advised by Council individually to ensure they are kept informed on proposed works and timelines.

The works on Sewell Street will also be advertised to the whole community as access to the Farmers Co-op will be affected during various stages of works.



## KELLERBERRIN FACILITIES UPDATE

### Kellerberrin Memorial Swimming Pool Carpark

The Shire of Kellerberrin having the Pool Car park funding approved through the Local Roads Community Infrastructure Program (LRCIP) Phase 4 commenced and completed the construction of a new car park for the new Swimming Pool.

The Car park includes sixty one (61) car parking bays including three (3) disabled bays to ensure inclusiveness for all to access Councils new facility. The car park included garden beds and footpaths for access and aesthetics at the facility.

Council in demolishing the old pool kept items to ensure that we retain memories of the old pool to be incorporated into the new pool being;

- Pool entrance gate including “Kellerberrin Memorial Swimming Pool” wording,
- Diving blocks;
- and Bench seat.

All items are on display in the car park to recognise the history of the old pool.


