### February 2024 Council Meeting Outcomes

Council held its February Ordinary Council Meeting on Thursday, 8th February 2024. Some of Council decisions included:

- That Council direct staff to review the event management plan and approval process alongside consultation with Environmental Health Officer for the new Years Eve Event.
- That Council agree to issue Planning Approval for an eight metre tall non-functioning windmill, which is be used as a garden ornament for a climbing plant, subject to the fan being modified to prevent rotation.

### Annual Electors Meeting

Council held the Annual Electors Meeting on Thursday, 8th February 2024.

### March 2024 Council Meeting Outcomes

Council held its March Ordinary Council Meeting on Monday, 18th March 2024. Some of Council decisions included:

- That Council revokes the Management order over Reserve 37975, being Lot 416 on Deposited Plan 185227 to enable this lot to become freehold title and agrees to an access easement across the south west corner of Lot 307 on Deposited Plan 87865 for access to Lot 416 on Deposited Plan 185227.
- Council adopted the 2023/24 Budget Review as presented.
- That Council receives the minutes of the Shire of Kellerberrin Electors Meeting held at the Cuolahan/Cottle Room at the Kellerberrin Recreation Centre on Thursday, 8th February 2023, with the amendment that the reference to Mrs Beryl Otley be removed from the question raised from Renza Bishop.

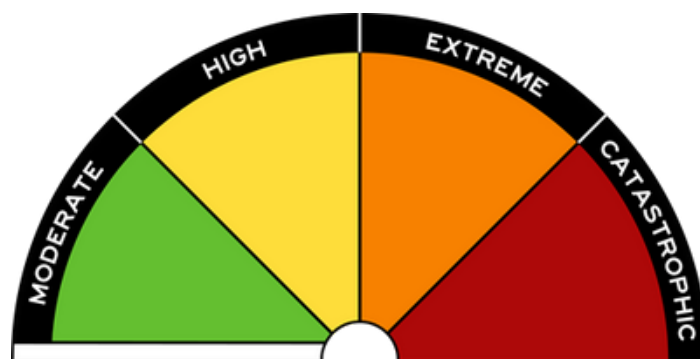

What a great season it was, with the community enjoying the new facility!







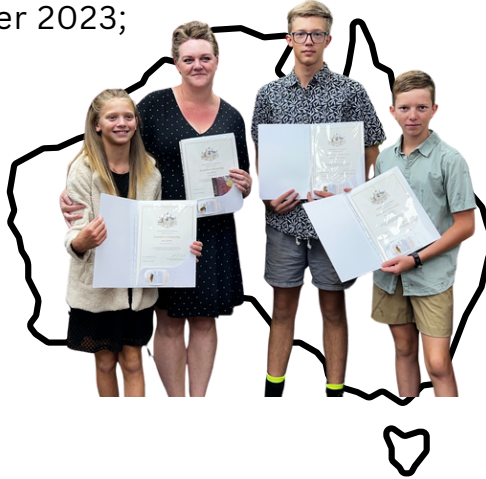
## COUNCIL UPDATES

## COUNCIL UPDATES

### Community Budget Submissions 2023/2024

Is your group in need of funds for a project? The Shire of Kellerberrin awards up to \$30,000 in funding each year to local sporting and community groups who can apply for funding to assist with their given project or event. Applications are now open for this year's round of funding and Council invites all sporting and community groups to apply for its Annual Community Grants under the following categories:

#### COMMUNITY DONATIONS Max \$2,000 per applicant

(Council Budget Allocation \$20,000) Examples of eligible projects under this category include a new initiative or a significant one off project, capital project and repairs or maintenance or improvement to Council owned/managed facilities.

#### PUBLIC RELATIONS Max \$300 per applicant

(Council Budget Allocation \$3,000) - Examples of eligible projects under this category include public relations promotion through donations, sponsorships and waivers of fees and charges for Council owned/managed facilities.

#### COMMUNITY GRANTS Max \$3,000 per applicant

Council Budget Allocation \$7,000) - Examples of eligible projects under this category include organisations that provide services or programs to residents of the Shire on an ongoing basis.

- Thank you to the community members that assisted on the day!





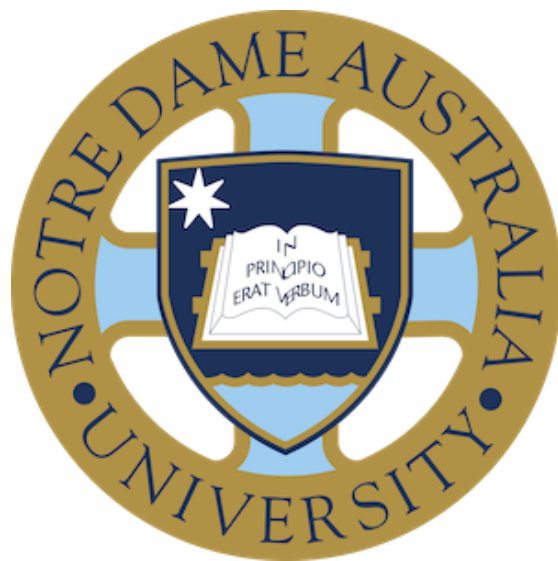


## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING AROUND THE SHIRE? Wheatbelt Medical Student Immersion Program

## **ROADWORKS UPDATE**

### **Shire of Kellerberrin 2023/2024 Road Program**

#### **Doodlakine South Road–Reseal of the following sections; - 0.86–1.45, 2.80–5.17, - 5.49–5.95**

Council has completed all scheduled resealing works on all the abovementioned sections with a 14mm reseal. The reseal is part of Councils maintenance program for sealed roads to provide additional service life for a sealed road.

#### **Doodlakine South Road–Reconstruct and Seal; -5.97 – 7.90**

Council has also completed a full reconstruction of Doodlakine South Road from SLK 5.97 – 7.90. The reconstruction works included widening of the pavement to 11m with suitable off road drainage, wet-mixing the pavement material, trimming pavement and providing a two coat seal to 8m wide for the full section. To complete works guideposts have been installed.

#### **Doodlakine South Road–Clearing Permit Application for 9.70–12.45 SLK.**

Councils consulting Natural Resource Management Officer is currently working through the application process with mapping and data collection for the permit application.

The application has been lodged with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation. Council is currently working with the Department to finalise it offset requirements to ensure the permit can be advertised seeking submissions.

#### **Kellerberrin Yelbini Road–Clearing Permit Application**

Councils consulting Natural Resource Management Officer is currently working through the application process with mapping and data collection for the permit application. This process will be ongoing for the remainder of the financial year with the clearing permit application intended to be lodged by the 30th June 2024.

#### **Gravel Sheetting**

Council has completed gravel sheetting works on two (2) sections of Goldfields Road where it had access to gravel being from Doodlakine-Kununoppin Road West and from Baandee North Road to the Shire Boundary.

#### **Road Maintenance – Maintenance Grading**

Council staff and contractors have continued to complete road maintenance with the following roads being attended to over the past few months;

- Mission Road.
- Goldfields Road
- Mather Road

## **TOWN STREETS**

### **Hammond Street**

Council has completed the road construction, footpath and crossover works associated with the Hammond Street project. To complete these works Council is to concrete the offshoot drains from Hammond Street to the drain that runs along Scott Street to alleviate erosion issues in that area.

### **Connelly Street**

Council has completed the road construction, footpath and crossover works associated with the Connelly Street project. To complete these works Council is to repair a section of road on Moore Street where a water pipe was replaced. This work is expected to be completed in late April when contractors are in town to complete works on Sewell Street.





## **Shire of Kellerberrin 2023/2024 Road Program Continued**

### **Sewell Street**

Council has completed its planning phase for the Sewell street works and has completed a program of works which includes.

The physical onsite works for Sewell Street will commence on Friday 5th April 2024 with the brick pavers on the footpath South of the IGA entrance being removed and concrete drains cut ready for removal. Friday will also see the setup of traffic management and the commencement of traffic management for Sewell St.

Saturday 6th April

- (am) IGA Carpark profiled out to enable new material to be imported
- (pm) Sewell Street profiled out to enable concrete and asphaltting.

Sunday 7th April

- Carting in of material and trimming IGA carpark to enable sealing and asphaltting.

Monday 8th April – 12th April

- Completing IGA car park construction.
- Preparing the footpath south of IGA entrance and car parking bays on west side of Sewell St for concreting.
- Sealing of Sewell Street and IGA car park with single coat.

Monday 15th April – Sunday 21st April

- Concreting footpath on South side of IGA entrance and car parking bays on west side of Sewell Street

Monday 22nd April – Sunday 28th April

- Removing bricks and pavers from eastern side of Sewell Street
- Setup and concrete footpath
- Removing brick and pavers from North of IGA entrance around to GEH side of IGA.
- Setup and concrete footpath

Monday 29th April

- Asphaltting of Sewell Street

On completion of the above there will still be works associated with Sewell Street with installation of bollards and line marking though the major construction works and traffic issues will be complete.

Please note the above is only a guide and list major works not all works and is subject to change due to weather, contractor availability and unforeseen issues. Please see IGA, Kellerberrin Takeaway, Shire & CRC windows for the traffic closures during this period.

Council will attempt to ensure we keep the community abreast of any updates as they come about as we recognise these works albeit required will create access issues for our community to IGA. Please work with us during this time and adhere to all traffic instructions.
